



#### Abbreviated Minutes of a meeting of Bridge Parish Council Thursday 8 October 2015 in Bridge Village Hall at 7.30p.m.

(Full version on website <u>www.bridgevillage.co.uk</u> and BPC noticeboards. BPC = Bridge Parish Council; CCC= Canterbury City Council)

#### **Recreation Ground**

The annual firework display will take place on the Recreation Ground on 7 November. Security fencing around the children's play area will be fitted and the ladies toilet in the pavilion improved. There will be a logo competition for school children. New signs on the Recreation Ground will carry the new logo.

#### **Cantley Development Proposals**

#### The Chair stated that

The recreation ground lease expires in 2023. The recreation space and all of the buildings and tennis courts on it, including the children's play area, could disappear.

There is great pressure for housing development in Canterbury district.

We would do well to manage this process by agreement with potential developers rather than by allowing less controlled development to take place without any village benefits.

Villagers raised questions about the legal status of the recreation ground and its lease, the environmental impact of the proposed development and its location. Could the recreation ground lease renewal be detached from the housing proposals? Where to site a new village hall? Could the recreation ground be purchased? The status and content of the Draft Neighbourhood Plan were also raised.

CCC does not have a 5 year supply of land as requested by the planning inspector so it will be very difficult to turn down planning requests for new housing.

All of the formal information from Cantley estates is on the village website and villagers' views will be heard through an open surgery meeting on Saturday 7 Nov (2-4) and Saturday 28 Nov (9.30- 11.00) in the village hall. BPC will consider opinions before taking next steps.

#### **Green Court**

Kent County Council (KCC) will not dig up the existing tarmac, landscape and maintain the area. Consultation with those who live in the area is needed on suggestions to be formulated by BPC.

#### Illegal parking

KCC officials are aware.

#### Mill Centre

#### The Reverend Pamela LLoyd (our Vicar's mother)

The Dean of Canterbury writes...

Pamela LLoyd, who died on 25th September 2015 under a month short of her 90th birthday, was a pioneer in women's ministry. Her life and her own ministry paved the way for the acceptance of women's ministry today. Speaking in 1978, when the vote for the Ordination of Women had been lost in the General Synod House of Clergy she said: "I have far greater faith in God than in the clergymen of the Synod. I believe that if God wants women to be priests, God will have them as priests. I do not know how it will happen, but I know it will happen."

Pamela Bampton was born on 20th October 1925. Her father was a Civil Engineer, holding the rank of Colonel in the British Army in India but Pamela was born in London and came back to England for her education, enduring long journeys by boat and often staying with other families in holiday time.

The War was the first of three events which radically altered the course of her life. She found herself in the headquarters of the Special Operations Executive (or SOE) with its highly secret business of dropping agents behind enemy lines. The second life-changing event came from the fact that Pamela worshipped at Holy Trinity Brompton where, at the evening service, she came under the influence of Canon Bryan Green and underwent a powerful conversion experience. She wrote of this experience, "I can feel the power and the strength of the Holy Spirit. I have never been so happy and contented in all my life." She informed her parents that she would not be returning to India and she began a journey that was to lead her to being selected for training as a Deaconess. She worked as a medical secretary; then with the Oxford Pastorate; and then as assistant to Ronald Hunt, Vicar of Malvern.

Pamela completed her training at Gilmore House, but at the same time the third life-changing event occurred, which was that she fell in love with Robert LLoyd the Curate at the local parish Church and accepted his proposal of marriage. As she left Gilmore House, she was told that she would never work for the Church of England and must now fulfil her vocation as a wife and mother. Robert was required to compensate the college by paying them a third of a year's stipend.

Pamela achieved much in her life, but being a wife and a mother was one of those achievements. She produced four sons, two of whom are now priests themselves, supported Robert in his ministry and created a home, wherever the family went.

As well as bringing up four sons, Pamela began to develop a ministry of her own, outside the structures of the Church. She trained as a counsellor and for many years worked with the Marriage Guidance Council (now Relate). She developed her skills of listening and her experience of working with broken people from all walks of life. She came to Canterbury Cathedral to work as the Personal Assistant to the manager of the Gift Shop. When he retired the Cathedral wanted to develop its merchandising in one direction and Pamela wanted to go in another. So she moved on and bought Conquest House in Palace Street, which she ran as a very successful gift shop for a number of years. She gave the profits from the business to the Diocese, to be used for the care of clergy.

But the call to ministry never left her. Four times during her life she came into Canterbury Cathedral to be Commissioned or Ordained by four different Archbishops, Ramsey commissioned her as a Parish Worker, Coggan licensed her as a Deaconess, Runcie ordained her as a Deacon and Carey as a Priest. From 1976 to 1985 she worked at All Saints' Canterbury. Her Vicar, David Matthiae, said of her, "I would always give her the most challenging families to visit in the parish, and with no hesitation she would whiz off on her bicycle to see them." She also, at different times, exercised a ministry in some of the local hospitals and at the prison.

Her preaching ministry had begun at the age of 18 and she went on to preach at such places as Downing College Cambridge, Lincoln Theological College and Bedgbury Park School, as well as being the first woman to preside regularly at the mid-week Eucharist in Canterbury Cathedral. Her early experience of spirituality and one-to-one counselling gave rise to a lifetime of ministry to individuals, and she helped to lead a number of pilgrimages as well as skilfully leading many different prayer and study groups.

From 1995 almost to the end of her life she was a regular and active member of the congregation of Canterbury Cathedral and she and Robert engendered much love and affection. After Robert's death two years ago Pamela's own health began to fail but she never lost her interest in all that was going on around her or her cheerful courage as she became increasingly less mobile. Happily she lived to see the consecration of women as Bishops and retained a lively memory of every step that it had taken to reach that moment right to the end.

hib a shell length less than 3 years old, has a shell length less than 10 cm, is under the or at all unwell then we would recommend not hibernating it but keeping it aways over winter in a heated vivarium.

It is also important to ensure that your tortoise does not hibernate with undigested food in it's stomach as this can make them very poorly. As the temperature drops and the tortoise cools down they will start to slow down and will stop eating. They shouldn't eat for 2-4 weeks before hibernation to ensure their stomachs are fully empty.

During hibernation the most important thing is to try and maintain the tortoises body temperature between 3 and 7 degrees C and not allow it to fluctuate which is easier said than done!

Tortoises hibernate best in strong plastic boxes with ventilated lids about half filled with soil. The tortoise will bury himself in the soil and this will help keep his temperature constant much more than using straw or paper. They are best kept in brick outbuildings as these stay cool but protected from frost. It's a good idea to use a min-max thermometer underneath the soil in the hibernating box which you can check every couple of weeks.

Tortoises tend to start waking up again about March when the weather becomes milder and at this stage you should move the box to somewhere warmer and allow them to gradually wake up naturally. Once they are awake they should be placed in a bath of luke warm water for about 10 minutes to help them rehydrate as it is dehydration rather than starvation that most affects them as they come out of hibernation.

Our other big concern at Bourne Veterinary Practice at this time of year is that fireworks season is underway and many pets get very frightened by the unusual loud noises and bright lights.
