

Bishop Richard Llewellin, retired Bishop of Dover, was our guest preacher at Bridge on Easter Day and he shares here his Easter message:

Easter Day 2015

Bridge

The first Easter was a foretaste of things to come, a trailer, a promise, a kind of pilot project for the whole cosmos. What God did for Jesus that explosive first Easter morning is what He plans to do one day for the whole of his creation.

We who live on this planet in the interval between Jesus' Resurrection and the final rescue and transformation of the whole world are invited to live as *new creation people* in the here and now, grasping in our own lives before this final rescue and transformation the new style of living of the life of the world yet to come.

Now, this may sound fantastic. You may say, "We don't even know what this new style of living is all about!" But we do! We have already seen it in action in the life and death of our friend and Lord, Jesus. His was the life of the kingdom of God, lived out in the dust and dirt of this planet. And he invites us to do the same, in His strength, in the power of His Holy Spirit. That is the hidden meaning of the greatest festival Christians have.

This true meaning has remained hidden because the Church has trivialised it, and the world has rubbished it. The Church has turned Jesus' resurrection into a "happy ending" after the dark and messy story of Good Friday, often scaling it down so that "resurrection" becomes a fancy way of saying "He went to Heaven". Easter then means: "There really is life after death".

But "resurrection" to first-century Jews wasn't about "going to Heaven": it was about the physically dead being physically alive again. Some Jews (not all) believed that God would do this for all people on what they called 'the last day'. Nobody, including Jesus' followers, was expecting one person to be bodily raised from the dead *in the middle of history*.

The stories of the resurrection are certainly not "wish-fulfilments" on the part of the first disciples, nor are they the result of a refusal on the part of his friends to accept that their master and teacher had been taken from them, after they had expected so much from him. Indeed the opposite is true: disillusioned and frightened, they simply scarpered: as far as they were concerned, it was all over, finished.

First-century Jews who followed 'would-be messiahs' knew that if your leader got killed by the authorities, it meant you had backed the wrong person. You then had a choice: give up the revolution or get yourself a new leader. The disciples of Jesus gave up. Going around saying that he'd been raised from the dead wasn't an option.

Unless, of course, he had been.

Jesus of Nazareth was certainly dead by the Friday evening. Roman soldiers were professional killers, and wouldn't have allowed a not-quite-dead rebel leader to stay that way for long. When the first Christians told the story of what happened next,

they were not saying: "I think he's still with us in a spiritual sense" or "I think he's gone to heaven". They said, "He is alive, wonderfully alive, gloriously alive, alive with the life beyond death and the grave ... and it is the very last thing we expected or hoped for!"

The responsible historian must explain how else Christianity got going in the first place, and why it hailed Jesus as Messiah despite His execution. After all, he hadn't defeated the Romans, or rebuilt the Temple, or brought justice and peace to the world, all of which a Messiah should have done. The only explanation that will fit the evidence is the one the early Christians insisted upon — Jesus really had been raised from the dead. His body was not just reanimated. It was transformed, so that it was no longer subject to sickness and death.

Let's be clear: the stories are not about someone coming back into the present mode of life. Lazarus did that; Jesus didn't. They are about someone going on into a new sort of existence, still emphatically bodily, if anything, more so.

Now, suddenly, the real meaning of Easter comes into view, as well as the reason why it has been trivialised and sidelined. Easter is about a new creation that has already begun. It is worth saying that a second time: Easter is about a new creation that has already begun. God is remaking His world, challenging all the other powers that think that is their job to do so. This diverse and magnificent order of creation, will all its glorious, abundant beauty, is reaffirmed on the other side of the thing that has always threatens justice and beauty — death.

Christianity's critics have always sneered that nothing has changed. But everything has. The world is a different place, because of the resurrection of Christ. We now know that evil, sin and death will be finally defeated, and that goodness, truth and beauty will prevail. This gives you and me, for instance, the confidence to work with real hope in apparently hopeless situations, where the cynic would say, "What's the point?" We can be confident that a life lived out in love and trust and in the service of others will not be a life lived out in vain!

How the money is spent

For every pound raised Christian Aid puts 86p directly into fighting poverty. Another 13p goes back into fund-raising so they can raise the next pound. The last penny pays for its running costs, ensuring it can keep carrying on the work.

Notes from a meeting of BRIDGE PARISH COUNCIL held on Thursday 9 April 2015

Matter raised by a member of the pulbic.

Mr Joe Connor expressed his disapproval at the felling of a copper beech tree at Beechmount. He asked if the Parish Council was aware that this was going to happen and what has been done since. Cllr Hill replied, quoting from an email received from the owner of the property and also from an arborist's report, commissioned by the owner. He said that Bridge Parish Council had never been consulted about the loss of this tree.

Recreation Ground:

Cllr Ward reported good use of the playgound area over the holiday period with an attendant rise in litter. The moles seem to have been reactivated by the onset of spring. Cllr Hodges thanked volunteers who participated in the Recreation Ground working party on 21 March 2015. The Clerk reported that the new mowing contractor had already carried out two cuts of the grass. Discussion then ensued about charging for the use of the refurbished pavilion on the recreation ground. It was agreed that payment by users should always be to one source (BVST or Bridge Parish Council) with a partition of funds between these groups to take place before the end of the relevant financial year.

Nail bourne

Cllr Atkinson reported that the latest report on groundwater levels in the area indicated a fall of 1 metre in the last two weeks. Bridge Ford will remain closed for another month although the gaugeboards in the village have started to record a falling river level. There is no tankering or overpumping along the Nailbourne at present and very little prospect of flooding this spring. The Council supported Cllr Atkinson's suggestion that names should be forwarded to him of villagers who might be willing to participate in a research project being sponsored by King's College, London regarding the fear of flooding.

Neighbourhood Plan

Joe Connor reported that Bridge is well ahead of most councils for Neighbourhood Planning. The Bridge plan is heavily dependent on acceptance by relevant Inspectors of the Canterbury City Council Plan. This is likely to take some time.

Matters for Discussion and Action

- a. To discuss the provision of a bin to deal with dog mess on the water meadow near the ford. Cllr Edmonds led the discussion which culminated in an agreed proposed location of a green coloured bin in close proximity to the water meadows.
- b. To review the election timetable in preparation for May 7 elections. The Clerk reminded the meeting of key dates in the current electoral cycle and

pointed out that full details are available from him.

- c. To discuss the nomination for a KALC award in 2016. Cllr Hodges' suggestion that Cllr Hill be nominated for outstanding length and quality of service met with unanimous approval.
- **d. Annual Parish Meeting 30 April 2015.** Cllr Hodges ran through the arrangements for the evening.
- **e. Sale of the Mill Centre**. A 6 month moratorium on the sale of the building is now in place. The meeting agreed unanimously that there must be an energetic response to the issue once elections results are known.
- f. A BPC response to the rural enforcement questionnaire from Canterbury City Council-Cllr Hodges led the meeting through the completion of the response form for Canterbury City Council.
- g. A BPC response to the Concurrent Funding questionnaire from Canterbury City Council-Cllr Hodges led the meeting through the completion of the response form for Canterbury City Council.
- h. The Council ratified the draft emergency plan as published prior to the meeting. This was agreed unanimously.

Any Other Business

Cllr Ward reminded all present of the forthcoming village litter pick on <u>Saturday 18 April 2015 at 9.30 am</u>, with volunteers meeting at the junction of Conyngham Lane and High St.

Cllr Hill expressed his deep thanks to all fellow councillors on the occasion of his final meeting after over 35 years of service.

Cllr Atkinson will attend a KALC meeting on 21 April 2015 to discuss future working relationships with the new committee structure of Canterbury City Council.

Cllr Hodges asked for interested parties to contact the Clerk if they wished to be involved in a national survey of war memorials. She also expressed her thanks to all councillors for the support she has received in her two years as Chairman of the Parish Council.

The meeting closed at 9.30 p.m.


