

I have just returned from a trip to Australia and New Zealand, visiting friends and family. I had a close and personal encounter with nature at Byron Bay. Watching out for sharks, my eyes were focused on the horizon for those fast moving fins. (A number of people, including a honeymoon couple have been killed there in recent years). So fixed were my eyes on the long-distance, that I failed to recognise dangers at closer range. Both my legs become lunch for a large Portugese Man of War jelly fish, known locally as a blue bottle. For several hours I hopped around in agony, and completely missed my opportunity to surf the waves. Like Bill Byson, I feel that I have experienced the wildlife of Australia! This huge and hot country, with so many exotic and dangerous animals. The guy who picked me up off the beach said, 'you are lucky the box jellyfish didn't taste you. You would have a gonner, mate!'

In New Zealand, Sue and I travelled around the South Island, and enjoyed the fjords and mountains. On our last day we were the guests of the former Bishop of Christchurch, who drove us round the earthquake damaged city. Although the big earthquake was 5 years ago (this month), there remain whole areas of the city full of half demolished buildings, over 60 churches were destroyed, and the cathedral stands there with half its roof and the spire missing. Nearly 200 people were killed five years ago, and two further earthquakes shook the city just days after we had left. I joined the cathedral congregation in the Transitional Cathedral, which is made completely of cardboard. What struck me about the people I met was a sense of ongoing woundedness and grief, but also a deep sense of hope and determination to regenerate the city and its people.

I found myself reflecting that this is a good visual image of the Good Friday and Easter experience. For the disciples on Good Friday, all seemed lost. The Easter experience that followed showed them that God transcends death itself and gives hope and joy - as real today as 2000 years ago. Easter calls us to regenerate our lives and communities.

We have a rich offering of different services in Holy Week and Easter in the Bridge family of churches, and all are warmly invited. See page 12.

The Little Stour & Nailbourne River Management Group continues to monitor the Nailbourne and the valley sewer and to liaise with all the relevant agencies and to work with them towards long-term solutions for the difficulties at times of high groundwater levels. It is interesting to note that Peter Gay, who lives at the top end of the valley and writes the Nature Notes for the Kentish Gazette, has observed that the Nailbourne is running along its entire length for the fourth year in succession. He comments that

this is probably a 100-year record.

Brewery Lane ford is now closed. Keeper's Hill at Patrixbourne is open (at the time of writing) but deemed too deep for safe passage.

Local History

A memorial service for the life of Lewis 'Laurence' Boyle was held at St Mary's, Patrixbourne on Friday January, 22nd, lead by Margaret Clarke.

Laurence was a long-term Patrixbourne resident and took a keen interest in the history of the village. He assembled a great deal of information on the history of Bifrons and gave a talk on the subject to the Bridge and District History Society. Laurence's detailed archives have been donated to the village by his family and it is hoped that it will be possible for a local person to build on his research and finish the book he started following his talk to the society.



Abbreviated Minutes of a meeting of Bridge Parish Council Thursday 11 February 2016 in Bridge Village Hall at 7.30 p.m.

A member of the public addressed the meeting on the subject of minute 112/15-16 (a) from the meeting held on 14 January 2016.

Report from Canterbury City Councillor (Simon Cook)

He noted that fly tipping is an increasing issue in the district. Villagers should let him know of any hot spots. The City Council will start a community governance review in 2016 including a look at further devolution of powers to parishes.

Report from Kent County Councillor (KCC) Michael Northey.

KCC has passed its budget for 2016-2017 showing a 3.99% increase in council tax, occasioned by increasing expenditure in adult social care and grant reductions from central government amounting to £18 million. Front line services are being modified where necessary but remain largely intact. The mobile library consultation ends on 4 March. It is proposed that the library will visit Bridge once every fortnight and that borrowers will be able to borrow up to 30 items each. Comments are still welcomed

Decisions taken in the course of the meeting. Council agreed to:

replace the defective cradle swing with a new swing in the play area.

fund **a first aid course** to provide basic life-saving first aid including the use of CPR (cardiopulmonary resuscitation). Local employers will be invited as a priority and asked for a donation towards the costs which will amount to approx. £225.

fund the necessary tree survey of the **Green Court** area to see which parcels of the KCC land can be developed. A team of councillors will ask local residents for their views on a range of possible improvements to the landscaping of the area.

upgrade the pavilion kitchen.

invite a **speaker from Speedwatch to address the Annual Parish Meeting** on 28 April 2016. write to CCC and KCC about the disruption caused **by simultaneous road closures** locally. publish all of the latest Cantley information on the parish website.

Dates and events to note:

Village event on 12 June to mark the Queen's 90th birthday on the Recreation Ground 5 March 2016 from 10.30-12.30 there will be a village-wide litter pick involving the beavers and cubs as part of the national "Cleaning for the Queen" project.

Neighbourhood Plan

Joe Connor, Chair of the Neighbourhood Plan group stated that he wished to see the Bridge plan completed (and submitted to Canterbury City Council as required) within this calendar year.

New road junction on the A2. The Chair repeated his concern about the apparent complacency of planners that "all will be fine" at the northern end of Bridge High St. The new junction will be planned by Highways England and funded by housing developers. It will probably be built some 4-5 years after houses have started to be built in South Canterbury.

Speedwatch training for the village on 9 February was attended by 15 people.

Mill Centre

Council discussed the proposed lease for the Mill Centre to be issued by CCC for a period of 30 years. It also discussed its future arrangements for working with the Mill Centre Management Committee.

Once your pet has been admitted for the procedure they will be given a pre-op sedative which will help relax them. An intravenous catheter is then placed in their leg to allow the administration of the anaesthetic and fluids. As soon as your pet is asleep a tube is placed down their throat so that the anaesthetic can be maintained using a gas machine.

During the procedure your pet will be monitored continually by a fully qualified veterinary nurse. They will keep a close eye on the heart and respiratory rate, blood pressure and oxygen saturation of the blood as well as the ECG and your pet's temperature.

Once it's time for your pet to wake up they will be placed in a warm quiet kennel and be closely monitored until they are fully awake. Most pets are able to go home on the same day as they have their operation as they are usually happier recovering at home!
