

Patrixbourne with Bridge Annual Church Meeting

In the March edition of 'On the Nail' we announced that the Annual Parochial Church Meeting (APCM) would be held on Sunday 10 April following the11am Morning Service. It was hoped this would encourage a greater participation as we face financial and fabric challenges (especially at Bridge Church). This new arrangement attracted an attendance figure of 25 compared with 15 last year on a Thursday evening.

The meeting was preceded by the Annual Meeting of Parishioners (aka Vestry Meeting) when our 4 Churchwardens were thanked for their dedicated service through 2015 and previously; their willingness to stand again; and they were unanimously re-elected. Jonathan opened the APCM by distributing 2 pages headed 'Growing a Healthy Church' extracted from 'the Healthy Churches' Handbook' by Canon Robert Warren, first published in 2004 and regularly reprinted. The following 'Marks of a healthy church' were introduced and commended for study (1) Energised by faith (2) Outward-looking focus (3) Seeks to find out what God wants (4) Faces the cost of change and growth (5) Operated as a community (6) Makes room for all and (7) Does a few things and do them well. More copies are available, individual feedback invited and it will be appear on the PCC agenda. Clive Medhurst, retiring treasurer was thanked for his service, and his replacement, Devin Brougham, was officially appointed and welcomed. He 'shadowed' the preparation of the Financial Statement 2015 and this enabled him to draft a Budget for 2016. Reports received on the fabric of both churches; 81 names on the Electoral Roll; and from the various church organisations including the Friends of both churches. They were all thanked with a special mention made for the setting up of the 'Friends of St Peter's' (FOSP) last August in response to the challenge to raise about £90,000 to repair the fabric of the church. To be done by arranging community events and making grant applications. (Note our financial progress is displayed on a 'thermometer' to be seen in the kitchen

The Parochial Church Council (PCC) was thanked for its past work and encouraged for the future. It consists of the 4 Church Wardens, Hon Treasurer, Lay Reader, with 6 continuing members, John Hill re-elected with Peggy Pryer and Brenda Rubin newly elected members. Alan Barber (Hon PCC Secretary)

Bekesbourne Annual Church Meeting

Seventeen parishioners attended the annual meeting of St Peter's Church on 13 April. The PCC reported another successful year in terms of church attendance and special services. Thanks were given to Pat Kusel who has led the Family Service in Bekesbourne with enthusiasm and dedication for the last 20 years and who decided to stand down in January.

The accounts for 2015 showed a small surplus. We did not hold any big fund raising events in last year. In 2016 we are planning several events. The choristers are coming on11 June. The gardens at The Old Palace are open on 25 and 26 June. The Friends' are planning a Craft Fair in the Barn at Woolton Farm in September. Thanks were given to the band of helpers who work to support Bekesbourne church with enthusiasm and generosity throughout the year.

Jill Gillanders was re-elected as churchwarden for the coming year. Pat Kusel continues as vice chairman, Nicky Fry was re-elected as PCC secretary and Zan Clifford continues as treasurer. Graham Duplock represents The Friends of Bekesbourne Church. Lindsay Sharp-Kinsey is our Electoral Roll Officer. The remaining members of the PCC are Amanda Barker, Jonathan Cowans, Jane Millyard and Sue Holmquist. A building subcommittee was set up in 2015 to look after the fabric of the church. Peter Rothwell from that committee looked into effective ways of replacing the heating system in the church. Infra-red heaters have been successfully installed this year. Thanks were given to him for all his time and endeavours.

ed by local authorities, police constables and community your dog is found to not have a microchip and be registered to

a database, you as the keeper will be served with a notice requiring the dog to be chipped in the next 21 days. If this does not occur you will be liable to pay a fine of £500.

There are no exemptions regarding age, a dog will only be legally exempt if a vet certifies that it cannot be microchipped for health reasons on a form approved by the Secretary of State.

Many of our patients are microchipped but the database registration is not up to date, so if you have moved house or changed your telephone number it is really important to update this information on the database.

Microchipping provides permanent identification of an animal. The microchip cannot be tampered with and once inserted will last a lifetime. The microchip itself is about the size of a grain of rice, encased in a special capsule, designed to sit comfortably under your pet's skin. The implantation is quick and simple – just like an ordinary injection under the loose skin at the back of the neck. Toffee Sauce

1 pint/600ml double or single cream and milk mixed (more cream = richer ice cream)
1oz/25g caster sugar
1 tin Carnation caramel
Up to 1tsp salt

Warm the milk/cream in a pan until blood temperature. Beat the eggs and sugar together in a bowl, add the milk and cream and then pour it all back into the pan. Stir it gently until it thickens slightly, then allow it to cool. Pour into an ice cream maker, adding the salt to taste, and caramel and churn until thick. Taste it again and see if it needs more salt. There's so much sugar in the caramel that the ice cream will probably not be particularly solid, so it should be put into a freezer and left for 24 hours to harden.

This makes approx. 1.5litres. Serve with a hot salt toffee sauce and toasted, chopped hazelnuts

Salt Toffee Sauce

3oz/85g soft brown sugar 2oz/50g butter 3floz (85ml) double cream Up to ½ tsp salt 1oz/25g chopped toasted (skins off) hazelnuts

Make the sauce by combining all the ingredients apart from the hazelnuts in a pan. Heat, while stirring, until the sugar has melted and the mixture smooth. Again, test for saltiness before eating!


