



These will alternate, so that we have Nackington and Patrixbourne one month and Bekesbourne and Bridge the other, to produce a predictable fortnightly pattern. We hope this situation will not last for too long. Meanwhile, we hope you will understand the predicament and forgive the disruption.

As you must be aware by now we have completed almost a year in yet another Interregnum, a time between priests. When an Interregnum occurs people often panic and it feels like you are on a ship without a Captain or pilot. It then becomes up to the passengers (congregations and communities) and crew to keep the ship safe and on course. The crew in this case are the Benefice Council, made up of the Churchwardens and worship leaders across the three parishes. We found ourselves this time unprepared and in strong winds and heavy seas as our local Deanery were in the throes of re-shaping and producing a mission plan to create a church fit for the future. This re-shaping together with the plan are almost complete so calmer waters lie ahead. In light of falling ordained clergy numbers, falling revenues in the parishes and falling congregations in most of the parishes it has been a difficult and stressful time. It has been made all the more difficult with no Archdeacon in office (until Jan. 2017) and still no Area Dean to chair the Deanery Synod. BUT we have not only survived but feel renewed thanks to the hard work of the worship leaders. churchwardens, retired clergy and Diocesan personnel as well as the support from our local communities.

I see lots of positives that can come out of interregnums. It is a time to reflect on where we are with our journeys of faith and our mission to our communities. To search our souls and seek guidance in prayer and strength in togetherness. Looking back over the past year it is interesting to see how far we have come. The communities have pulled together, e.g. rescuing the church building in Bridge, the establishments of 'friends' groups, and the new Songs of Praise, a true community service, in Bekesbourne. All resulting in new life and a positive forward looking approach. All facets of church life have continued. The place of Laity (non-ordained) in leading our faith communities into the future is now a vital part of our church and its mission. This has now been recognised by the General Synod and laity are being empowered to work alongside and in partnership with the clergy. Without the laity involvement rural church will not survive.

There will be fewer priests across the Deanery; there will possibly be less money to finance them and the running costs of the buildings, and this may lead to fewer services (certainly of communion). **BUT** here in Bridge Benefice the church is in good heart. People are finding renewed life and energy. The Holy Spirit is at work. The congregations and the communities have recognised that they have a vital role to play in the life of their church. There is an awakening of the laity and a realisation that **we are the church** and it's us who make it what it is. We all need to get engaged and 'put in' just as we 'take out.' By working together, in partnership with our new incumbent (hopefully by early 2018) we can re-shape and create anew the worship and mission across this Benefice.

The Grenfell Tower Appeal

No one can fail to have been moved by the tragedy of the fire at Grenfell Tower in North Kensington London. At 3am on the morning of the 14th June the local Parish Church of St Clement opened its doors as an emergency relief depot for the traumatised residents, others affected in the local community, and the emergency services. Additional relief centres were also set up in the area and volunteers and donations of food, clothes and many other things flooded in. St Clement's and its associated sister organisation the Clement James Centre are still heavily involved in the relief operation.

Our Parishes here have a strong link with St Clement's in that the Assistant Vicar at St Clement's, the Reverend Mary Clarke is the daughter of our Lay Reader, Margaret Clarke. Wanting to help in the best practical way we could, we took a collection at our Services on the 18th June, and prayed for all those involved in this disaster. They continue to remain in our thoughts and prayers. The sum of £625 has now been sent to the PCC of St Clement's Church.

The Rev Mary Clarke has written and says:

"My mum has kept me in touch with the generous and thoughtful collection that has been happening in your benefice - many, many thanks.

The response by so many has been amazing and extraordinary. We are very aware that this will take years of work and prayer and hope for the community. Many of our congregation were evacuated and some are still not back in their flats as there is no hot water. There are also those who do not want to move back which is understandable. They were living in the flats directly next to the tower. People are understandably traumatised. The money sent will be used to help all those directly affected by the fire."



FAIRTRADE NEWS



There's good news and bad news; first the good:

<u>CADBURY'S</u> parent company, Mondelēz International, is rolling out its own sustainable sourcing programme called Cocoa Life, across all Cadbury products. This is so they can safeguard their supply chain by taking complete responsibility for the sustainability of the cocoa they buy. The Fairtrade Foundation has been working with Mondelēz to make sure Fairtrade farmers have been properly consulted on the Cocoa Life programme, and that they will receive at least the same value as they have under Fairtrade certification. The farmers fully support the new scheme. So although you will no longer see the FAIRTRADE mark on your chocolate bars, you can be assured that the farmers will still be getting a good deal.

<u>And GREGGS</u> now have loads of Fairtrade products in their shops. You can pick up a fairer tea, coffee, hot chocolate, juice and bananas when you go into Greggs. In the 10 years that Greggs and Fairtrade coffee farmers have been working together, they've invested over £1 million into their farms and communities.

Now the bad:

<u>SAINSBURY'S</u>, once the leading supermarket in selling Fairtrade goods, have dropped the FAIRTRADE Mark from their own-brand tea and replaced it with their own 'Fairly Traded' label. The Fairtrade Foundation has major concerns about this watered-down scheme and Fairtrade farmers have written to Sainsbury's to express their dismay. There is also concern that all Sainsbury's Fairtrade certified products may go the same way.




Singing in Bridge

Concerned about the decline in hedgehog numbers, I investigated what could be done to encourage these spiny inquisitive little creatures into my garden.

My action plan was to:

Put a CD case-sized hedgehog door in my back gate Leave pockets of my garden to grow a little wild Add log piles to encourage invertebrates (hedgehog food) Provide a clean water source and make safe my pond Provide a hedgehog home made from large pots placed on their sides under dense shrubbery Avoid using slug pellets and chemicals in the garden.

To my delight I soon had my first prickly visitor to my back garden. He feasted on meal worms that the starlings had knocked off the bird table and then went to explore the garden.

My first hedgehog rescue was a hoglet approximately eight weeks old, found in broad daylight after it rolled down a steep bank. It was curled up on the side of the road. I gave him a health check and cat food and meal worms. His weight was satisfactory and he will be released safely near where he was found.

Dog or cat food with a meat but not fish base, and clean water (but not milk which is harmful for hedgehogs) provides a good meal for hedgehogs. You can encourage the hedgehog population in our villages by making your garden accessible and safe for these loveable creatures.

Contact me regarding general information. I can also offer advice and transport to wildlife vets and to rescue centres if you find a hedgehog in need.

te's Puddings illa Panna Cotta

Panna Cotta is a very under-rated Italian pudding – it means "cooked cream" and is just that. The gentle panna cotta is offset by a fruit compote or sauce, and is a delicious yet light pudding. I've used gelatine leaves in the recipe, as they give a quicker set and better texture than powder, plus fresh Kent cherries. Not being great at turning things out of moulds, I did mine in little glass ramekin dishes instead.

Panna Cotta: 4 leaves of gelatine 12 floz/350ml double cream 12 floz/350ml milk (full fat or semi-skimmed) 1 ½ oz/35g caster sugar 1 pod of vanilla

Cherry Compote: ¹/₂ lb/220g fresh cherries (preferably) with some extra to decorate small amount of sugar and water generous dash of some kind of fruit liqueur

6-8 ramekin dishes, depending on size

First, soak the gelatine in cold water until it goes soft. In a large pan, mix together the cream, milk and sugar. Break open the vanilla pod and scrape out all the little seeds with the point of a knife. Add the seeds to the mixture, plus the pod. Bring the temperature up to a gentle simmer, stirring to stop the milk sticking to the bottom of the pan. Remove the pod.

Squeeze out the gelatine leaves and add them to the pan, then take the pan off the heat and stir until the gelatine has dissolved, as you don't want stringy bits. Pour into a jug, and then into the ramekins. Leave a little room at the top for the cherries. Chill until set – approx 2 hours.

Stone the cherries and put them into a pan with a little water, sugar to taste, and Framboise or cherry liqueur. Simmer until the cherries release their delicious dark juice. Allow the cherries to cool before serving.

Serve with the cherry compote and the cracked black pepper tuiles. If you make double the amount of cherries, you can put them into the Black Forest Trifle later!


