Under the banner of our Diocesan vision statement **to be growing the Church numerically and spiritually, to reimagine ministry and to build partnerships that enrich ministry**, after many months of prayerful work and discernment our Synod recently approved new mission priorities. Under the banner of **'Changed lives, changing lives'** we committed ourselves to working more closely in mission with those in our communities that we are largely not reaching, in particular teenagers and the most marginalised in our communities. We also renewed our commitment to ensure that, as a Diocese, we offer the best training and resources we can to equip us a people in mission. All this we agreed must be begun and constantly enlivened in a life of prayer together. Work is continuing at pace on developing these mission priorities and we are all invited to consider how we respond locally.

With this call to missional prayer in mind, back in March Bishop Trevor issued an invitation to us to be part of a Diocesan day of prayer and fasting, on Saturday 18 November. There will be a Diocesan Day of Prayer at St Mary of Charity, Faversham, to which are invited. Very soon details of that day will be available. In addition, resources will be sent out to support local prayers gatherings for those who cannot make it to St Mary's. The whole Diocese is invited, by our Bishop, to pray for our renewal as a people in mission.

Let us pray together then, with hope and faith, for the way ahead together in mission. In the Bridge Benefice an important next step is the appointment of a Priest to join you. Let us pray together also for our Diocese, that through us the good news of Jesus Christ will continue to be made known in East Kent. I hope to see you at St Mary's!

Two legal challenges underway that concern the future of Canterbury and surrounding villages.

Earlier this year, Emily Shirley, a resident of Bridge and Michael Rundell, a resident of Wincheap, issued judicial review proceedings against the Secretary of State for failing to call in the Canterbury Urban South Extension application (Corinthian) on air pollution grounds.

According to a public health expert, air pollution contributes to 100 premature deaths in Canterbury annually. It also disables many more, especially children, the elderly and the weak.

The Corinthian application proposes 4,000 new dwellings, a relocated and enlarged Park and Ride, new slip road, schools and other services on farmland between Canterbury and Bridge. This is the biggest planning application Canterbury has ever seen and will likely add considerably to traffic congestion and pollution in and around Canterbury. It could add up to 28,000 extra vehicular movements daily.

The second legal challenge was issued on August 21st against the adopted Canterbury Local Plan. The cumulative impacts from the Plan's proposed developments on Canterbury's Air Quality Management Area (AQMA) had not been considered as required legally. An AQMA has to be designated where air quality limits are not being met. Canterbury's large AQMA comprises of parts of St Dunstan's Street, London Road, Whitstable Road, Station Road West, North Lane, St Peter's Place, Rheims Way, Wincheap, Pin Hill, Upper Bridge Street, Lower Bridge Street, St. George's Place, Old Dover Road, Broad Street, Military Road, Tourtel Road and Sturry Road.

The aim of the challenges is to ensure that Canterbury achieves compliance with air quality limits as soon as possible which will require a more sustainable approach to transport and planning for Canterbury and surrounding villages.

Around £9,500 has already been raised to help pay for the challenges. A further £15,000 is required to cover all legal costs.
