





## News from Bridge & Patrixbourne Church of England Primary School

Since the beginning of the academic year in September, it has been a very busy and successful time for our school. Our children exhibited at Art in Bridge and have opened up the school to parents and the community to view their learning. Our Year 6 children have performed both Romeo & Juliet and A Midsummer Night's Dream, a part of the Royal Shakespeare Schools' Festival, at the Gulbenkian Theatre, and as part of the Canterbury Festival, our orchestra performed in the Spiegel Tent.

It was fantastic to see so many people in the village community and beyond, attending our fireworks display and this helped us to raise much needed funds for the school, so that we can continue with the development of art and music, especially in this time of significant budget cuts. We have also contributed some of these funds to the Royal British Legion and to the Oncology Department at Kent & Canterbury Hospital.

I would like to take this opportunity to say thank you to Dr Jeremy Hayter, our previous Chair of Governors, for all his help, devotion and hard work, during his term as Chair.

Once again, I would like to say that it has been an absolute pleasure to have worked in our school and serve the local community and I would like to thank you for all your support and kindness; I will miss you all.

# Recreation Ground





# CHRISTIAN AID CHRISTMAS APPEAL 2017

This year Christian Aid's Christmas Appeal focuses on the fight against hunger and malnutrition In Burkino Faso and South Sudan. Hunger is not a simple problem; it's driven by issues such as climate change and conflict.

Aluel is the sole provider for her family. She runs a small business selling tea and bread at a market in South Sudan. But life has been a struggle. On a bad day her family would have just one meal consisting of wild leaves. Christian Aid has helped by providing food vouchers, enabling her to buy ingredients to cook nutritious meals for her children.

In Burkino Faso, Collette was forced to walk miles in 45°c heat, carrying her baby on her back, to search for gold in the country's gruelling mines. Christian Aid's market garden project gave her a plot of land and trained her to grow vegetables, providing the seeds and tools she needed. She said, "I no longer have to go to the mines and my children are not malnourished. The garden has changed my life".

Christian Aid wants everyone to have a story like Aluel and Collette. In a world of plenty, when we in this country can stock our larders and freezers to bursting point with luxury Christmas food, hunger like this should not exist.

If you would like to make a gift to Christian Aid this Christmas, the UK government's UKaid scheme will match every pound you give to the Appeal up to the 5 February 2018, meaning that even more people living in poverty can have their lives transformed.



#### Condensed minutes of a meeting of Bridge Parish Council Thursday 9 November 2017

Villager David Latham will contact Cllr Fawke with dates and times for defibrillator training-the new defibrillator is now located on the wall of the Londis shop.

Police cars will be patrolling lorries parked on the Highland Court access road to the A2.Villagers can suggest roads which should be added to the secondary roads list for maintenance during cold weather by contacting Kent County Council Highways department.

Villager and school PTA chair, Rob Moon, thanked the council for permission to use the Recreation Ground for the recent fireworks event, which was judged by all councillors to have been a great success. Cllr Hodges recorded her thanks to the children of the school for planting bulbs.

**Neighbourhood Plan:** Following a discussion about the nature of the Cantley proposals, whether their current offer represented the best offer obtainable and protocols governing the composition of the Neighbourhood Plan, Council agreed by 6 votes to 2 (those voting against were Cllrs Dhillon and Ferguson) to endorse the recently published Cantley proposals in a forthcoming leaflet and to include a statement from the council in the same leaflet to be distributed to all households over the period 18/19 November. This leaflet will remind villagers of the vote to be held on November 25 in Bridge Village Hall.

Joint meeting with other invited local parish councils held on 19 October 2017 to discuss HICO (Highland Court) development plans. The Chair reported back on the meeting. Another joint meeting of the parish councils will take place on November 23 at 7.30 in Bridge Village Hall. Cllr Fawke has joined the Barham Downs Action Group.

The parish council **budget for 2018-2019** will be set on 14 December. A note of the parish precept request has been asked for by Canterbury City Council with a final deadline of 31 December 2017.

Cllr Dhillon provided feedback on 3 separate **speedwatch sessions** on 16 and 26 October and 2 November. More volunteers are needed. 2 vehicles had been recorded at speeds of over 60 mph. **The next meeting will be on Thursday, 14 December 2017 at 7.00 p.m.**

## "This Turbulent Priest" -


written by Jane Hardy and Michael Conaghan and performed by actors Robert McCrea and Paul Kavanagh is a play produced by Bad Husky Productions in partnership with The Board of Canterbury Cathedral and very fittingly is being staged in Eastbridge Hospital which was originally built to provide hospitality for pilgrims visiting the tomb of St Thomas Becket.
