Canterbury Food Bank at Christmas

I am writing this to meet the deadline for the magazine, having just completed the busiest session I have experienced all year at the Distribution Café. We gave away every single bag we had on the van and the Bonus Table was seriously depleted. This was good news for all concerned and although we overran by 40 minutes and made the van late for its next commitment it was a very satisfactory session.

The response to the crisis in the Canterbury area for Food Banks has been excellent and we have Christmas approaching very fast. As Christmas Day and New Year's Day both fall on a Tuesday the All Saints' Distribution Café will not be operating on these two days.

This means that the Distribution Café at All Saints on Tuesday 18th will be the last one before the New Year and several of us have volunteered to attend the St Dunstan's Distribution Café on Friday 21st December to help make up the shortfall. This Centre will also not open on the following week either.

To this end, donations must be received in good time before these dates to allow the Collection Centre to process them into the Adults' bags (2 types) and children's bags plus fill the boxes with the items for the Bonus Table (excess items to those in the bags, plus additional items).

I shall be at the Café on Tuesday 11th December and will be collecting the bags from Evelyn the night before. This should give adequate time for the sorters and packers to process them in time for the following week. I shall then not be collecting donations until the New Year.

If you want ideas for items suitable for the season then the following may help, but please bear in mind that UHT milk, canned vegetables, Smash, baby foods, nappies, cereals, meat products in tins are still in demand.

Men's and Ladies' toiletries (deodorant, shower, hair etc), Children's confectionery, Household items, things you might treat yourself to (eg chocolates, chocolate biscuits), non-basic breakfast cereals, UHT cream, luxury jam etc. Try to avoid Christmas puddings, as I remember we still had these on the Bonus Table at Easter and mince pies in boxes are not suitable for storing at the Collection Centre. Think outside the box and come up with something simple but tasty and different. It could make all the difference at this time of the year for a family with little to look forward to. Thank you and Happy Christmas to everyone who has donated items during the year. They have all been much appreciated.

Thank you- what an amazing community response.

Thank you to everyone who turned out on Thursday 8th November, at Patrixbourne Church or Bekesbourne Recreation Ground, to welcome the 100 veterans and serving military personnel, walking the 100 miles 'Long Walk Home' from Ypres to the Cenotaph, to mark 100 years since the signing of the Armistice. Helping to put up the field kitchen, serving food, cake, tea or coffee, talking to the walkers: the organisers from Haig Housing were overwhelmed by the numbers of people who came out to help, and for the warmth of the community response to them during their short stop here. I hope we cheered them on their way!

Thank you to Year 6 pupils and staff from Bridge and Patrixbourne C.E.P. School who came to Patrixbourne Church on Friday 9th, to visit the six silhouettes representing the soldiers named on the War Memorial, and to hear their stories. The children brought poppies to decorate the church and laid wreaths at the war memorial. The pulpit was decorated with wool poppies made by ladies from Bekesbourne.

Thank you to everyone who visited the church over the weekend, the stewards who greeted them and the children who rang the bells at lunchtime on the 11th. At 4pm on the 11th we commemorated the six soldiers by listening to their stories and hearing poems, by singing hymns and war time songs, and by taking a collection for the charity 'Remembered', which encompasses six charities, supporting modern day Veterans and the Commonwealth War Graves Commission. Thank you to everyone who took part; over £230 was raised for the charity and it was a fitting way to say 'We Will Remember Them' about the six lost soldiers of Patrixbourne.



BOURNE VETS NFWS



All this cold weather is making us dream of summer holidays! Please be aware though that you may need to plan ahead if you want to take your pets away with you next summer.

The government has issued advice for pet owners outlining how pet travel arrangements may change if the UK leaves the EU with no deal. In a no deal situation, pet owners would still be able to travel to Europe with their pet after Brexit, but they could need to take additional steps and start preparations at least four months ahead of their planned departure date. If you are looking to travel to the EU with your pet after March 2019, then you should speak to your vet as soon as possible, ideally before the end of November 2018, to give enough time for health checks, vaccination and testing to be carried out. With the Easter holidays falling soon after EU exit day, it's essential that pet owners know to start planning ahead now to avoid disappointment.

At the moment if your pet is at least 12 weeks old and has a microchip, they can have a rabies vaccination, be issued a passport and travel 3 weeks after the vaccination date, with the rabies vaccine needing boosters within 3 years. If the UK leaves the EU with no deal we could be treated as an unlisted country and in this situation your pet will need a blood sample taken at least 30 days after the rabies vaccine and the results the blood test must show that the vaccination was successful. You must then wait 3 months from the date the successful blood sample was taken before you can travel. You will also need to take your pet to an Official Veterinarian (OV) no more than 10 days before travel to get a health certificate. This health certificate will be valid for 10 days after the date of issue for entry into the EU, for 4 months of onward travel within the EU and for re-entry to the UK for 4 months after the date of issue. On arrival in the EU, pet owners travelling with their pets will be required to enter through a designated Travellers' Point of Entry (TPE) where they may be asked to present proof of microchip, rabies vaccine and the blood test result alongside their pet's health certificate. In order to return to the UK your pet will need either an existing EU pet passport, an EU health certificate or a UK pet health certificate.

As we don't yet know what will be happening in March it's important to plan ahead and be prepared for the worst case scenario if you want to ensure that your pet doesn't miss their summer holiday!






