

Dear Friends

In the last few weeks of the school term in our Collective Worship sessions ('Assemblies') we have been exploring the concept of 'Community' and more specifically the concept of 'Koinonia' as the Christian fellowship or community of the early church. We shared a wonderful community event with the school at the end of June with the return of the Bridge Village Fete and look forward to sharing in more of these in the years to come!

All of this got me thinking about all the wonderful community activities we have going on in our own villages throughout the week. Just last week there was the monthly FISH scheme pop in coffee morning at Bridge, the monthly Wednesday coffee morning in Bekesbourne Village Hall, the regular weekly BREW session on Bekesbourne Rec (every Thursday afternoon) and the new 'Tea and Talk' session at Lower Hardres Village Hall (every Wednesday)! Coupled with which we have a number of delightful tea rooms in our villages where we can meet together with friends and enjoy food and friendship (congratulations to Tulip Tearooms* in Bridge which just celebrated its first anniversary!) If tea and cake isn't your thing we have some great pubs too and we are very much looking forward to Patrixbourne and Bridge's summer event at the Red Lion* which is taking place on the afternoon of 31st August – do join us if you can!

In our Churches we regularly host events (in addition to services to which everyone is always welcome) which we hope appeal to the wider community. July saw the ever popular Saturday morning Coffee Cake and Concert at Bridge presenting some wonderful performances from the talented students of the Langton Boys school and Lower Hardres hosting a splendid evening of music from the Canterbury Singers followed by wine and delicious canapes which were enjoyed by all.

I'm often asked by people who are lonely or perhaps new to the village, how they can get out and meet people, and my answer very often is 'maybe try coming to church' (well I am the Vicar!) Our churches are wonderful communities of local people who care about one another and about the community in which they live. They are people who know all about the groups, clubs and social interest groups and are only too willing to welcome newcomers and take them along to other events and activities that they are involved in. Our August service pattern is easy to follow, just one 10am service each week at one of our 5 churches each week and the services all include communion (which is of course optional) and coffee and biscuits afterwards (also optional!) but are designed to be welcoming to everyone even if you haven't been to church much, recently or ever! Singing familiar hymns together is a great way to build community and there are few places nowadays where we can get together to sing together as we do in church. Worship and prayer form the foundation of all that we do as they have done throughout the centuries our church buildings have stood and we hope will do for many centuries to come. Bridge & District History Society



New Stained Glass Window for Bridge Church

Exciting news for St Peter's Bridge. After a long period of planning, drafting and seeking appropriate permissions by the PCC and Churchwardens we are pleased to be able to share the following announcement with you.

"Between August 13 and 15 the Cathedral Studios will be replacing the Victorian clear glass west window (cinquefoil above two lancets) in the north aisle with a spectacular stained glass window. This has been designed and made by skilled artist Grace Ayson in the Studios over the last year, the idea for the replacement having been conceived 2 years ago. The window has been presented by me and my wife Elizabeth (who sadly died last November) in memory of our baby son Tom who died on 29 March 1974 (unexplained cot death) when exactly 100 days old. The window will have some 60 features in it relating to village scenes and local bridges, trains, railway tickets, cars, lorries and magnificent flora and fauna, as well as members of my family. It will include portrayals of Robert Runcie, Archbishop of Canterbury who confirmed me; my 8-greats grandfather who was an Archbishop of York and his wife, four of whose five children died as infants; and Archdeacon Jo. It features a marvellous rainbow with its reflections on the Nailbourne and has in its design an eternal heavenly element portrayed by a dove and a cross from which shine out rays of light over the many features below. I hope when you see it that you may agree it surpasses David Hockney's Queen's Window in Westminster Abbey! Michael Stewart July 2019"

At the end of August there will be an event at which the detail of the window will be presented and a booklet will thereafter be available explaining the provenance of each of the images it depicts. There will be a service to formally dedicate the window at

10am on Sunday 29th September all are welcome to join us for the special service and mark this wonderful historic addition to our ancient church building.

Great fun and good exercise

All Saints Food Bank Distribution Café

We are now enjoying the company of some new recruits who have volunteered and been cleared to work alongside the existing lovely people at the All Saints Distribution Café in the Military Road on a Tuesday morning. They will find this a rewarding experience with perhaps some challenges which may occur from time to time.

There is a yellow food bank collection point inside St Peter's Church, Bridge and the amount deposited there has increased week on week in the past 18 months. This is much appreciated.

At the beginning of my journey with the Food Bank Distribution Café I wrote about the items that are included in the Adult 1, Adult 2 and Children (2-16) parcels which are given out on production of a Food Bank Voucher for the appropriate number in a family, or a couple, or a singleton.

There is also a Bonus Table which includes, toilet rolls, toiletries, cleaning materials, pet food, baby food and nappies, larder clear outs (interesting mix), excess baked beans, soup, pasta and rice, sweet treats.


Having received their basic pack(s) they are invited to take whatever they can carry from the Bonus Table. A basic pack is based on feeding one person for 3 days in an emergency. The items from the Bonus table are there to boost this as well as to provide toiletries and cleaning materials, which are usually at the bottom of their budgets when faced with a financial dilemma.

To this end when considering what to purchase or to provide from your home please think about toiletries and cleaning materials as these help towards people in crisis improving their self-esteem. We have no shortage of baked beans, canned meat pies and soup in the Warehouse as these are the most popular items donated and I ask you to think outside of the box instead, for example: deodorants, shower gel, shampoo, STs, canned meat which can be sliced, canned fruit, custard, UHT full fat milk and fruit juice, packets of chocolate biscuits and bars of chocolate as a treat.

Just one item in the box will make a huge difference to someone's life.

Thank you. Food for Thought
