#### Celebrating 25 Years of the Friends of Bekesbourne Church <u>3 November 2019</u>

The Songs of Praise service at St Peter's Bekesbourne was a celebration of the 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the establishment of The Friends of Bekesbourne Church.

Zan Clifford, the first chairman of the Friends and Jane Millyard a former churchwarden gave the congregation of over 60 persons a vivid and thoroughly enlightening and entertaining description of the events leading up to the establishment of the Friends and its history over the years. The personnel involved were and are the most important part of the process and function of the Friends. They come from all areas of the village and are not necessarily churchgoers but have a strong sense of community. It was very evident that so many had played key parts over the years. The honours list was extremely impressive and a resounding affirmation of the many villagers who care about Bekesbourne Church.

(In the interest of fair play I have decided not to mention names because I am sure to offend by omission!)

The church at the time of the establishment of the Friends in 1994 was struggling. No major restoration work had been carried out since the 1880's. The village as a whole were asked if they valued the church as part of the village and wished it to remain open. At a meeting held in the village hall the verdict was a resounding YES and the Friends group was formed.

Initially the funds raised were for use across the Bekesbourne parish for various purposes. Importantly the scope of the application of funds raised was more closely defined on the instruction and advice of the diocese. The new constitution and definition read as follows ... "That the Friends is established to raise funds to maintain, protect and enhance the Church building and churchyard of St Peters Church, Bekesbourne." This remains true as the continuing and abiding scope of the use of the funds raised by the Friends.

Since the foundation of the Group many thousands of pounds have been raised at many and various events including dances, wine and wisdoms, exhibitions, flower festivals etc as well as an impressive Son et Lumiere in 2004.. Bekesbourne also has a Hundred Club which raises sufficient funds to cover the now expensive insurance bill of the church. Major building works including reroofing of the nave, vestry and the tower as well as much needed restoration of the stone work has been carried out. The church also has a regular churchyard working Party which keeps the churchyard in a very good condition. Other ambitious projects were undertaken by the PCC and the Friends funds provided the seed corn for the application for grants. Nearly £50,000 was raised to restore and renovate the Bevington organ and the six bells as recently as 2006. Perhaps the most basic but essential project has been the more recent design and build project of a toilet and a kitchen area, as well as the new heating system to keep us all warm.

The Friends have been at the forefront of all these projects and a warm village community has developed fostered by the enthusiasm and zeal of the many committee members who have served and continue to serve over the last 25 years. Thank you so much. Long may this spirit of community live on and prosper.

The next Songs of Praise service will be a Carol Service on the 1<sup>st</sup> December with carols chosen by the congregation.

This year as we move into Advent, that period of weeks when we take extra time to consider our faith, a time of preparation and waiting, we are interrupted by Politics. In January we will release the pace a bit as we seek to worship all together each Sunday in one church – reducing our heating costs and carbon footprint by only heating one church each week and enjoying the enrichment that comes from all joining to worship together.

I pray we will all have a considered and prayerful Advent, a very Happy Christmas and a blessed New Year!
