Dear Friends

We have already arrived in May and the year hurtles on. This month sees the retirement of our Bishop, Bishop Trevor, who I know is well known by many of you and who will be much missed. Since we are now well into Easter season I am sharing here his inspirational Easter message to all the parishioners of the Diocese of Canterbury entitle 'Hard-won hope':

"The true story of Easter – for it is no fairy tale – is a story of hope. *The* story of hope from which all others take their meaning. Hope can often be considered to be something of a wishy-washy phenomenon – a positive state of mind, an optimistic glass half-full perspective, which may bear no resemblance to reality – but at least it makes us feel better.

Such hope is a pale resemblance of what we encounter in the risen Christ on Easter morning. Christ does not give us cause for optimism, but rather the concrete assurance of a victory already won. It is this truth, this hope grounded in reality that every one of us and our increasingly divided society so desperately needs right now. Vain optimism will not solve the divisions of our age. Neither will the temptation to give in to despair – though, for many, the challenges of life seem so overwhelming. Signs of inequality, injustice and exclusion obscure the possibility of hope for many. Many in our own communities who feel increasingly excluded from a sense of common purpose, politically, economically and socially. Hope can feel like a pipe dream, an impossible and pointless exercise.

As St Paul says in his letter to the Hebrews, "faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen" (Hebrews 11:1). Faith is the gift of God to his people and the Church is called to live in and embody the kind of hope made real by faith – life-changing, concrete hope. The call to be a beacon of hope in our parishes and communities is not a call to ignore the signs of suffering and discontent around us. We must pay attention to these signs, lest they cause greater division and despair. Hope is hard. It is always costly for those who seek a different way; the way of reconciliation, justice and truth. For we cannot arrive at the joy and triumph of Easter morning without first travelling the path that leads to the cross, the way of Christ.

To walk this path we must intentionally place the poor, the marginalised, the disenfranchised and the voiceless at the heart of our work together. And in many, many different ways, we are already doing this. Every week I meet and hear the stories of those engaged in church-run food banks, night shelters, debt advice centres. I hear of people coming to faith through simple and honest human contact and compassion. Though we may be small in number and financially challenged, we will not give in to despair. We are a people of hope – hope for ourselves and for those we have yet to meet. Christ has declared hope for all of humanity and we are called to enact that hope in the hardest and most hopeless corners of our county. We will not walk away from being a living and serving presence on urban estates, in our seaside towns, in rural communities.

Transforming God, You bring hope to broken dreams and show us new possibilities. Renew us with open hearts, open minds and open wills, ready to follow wherever you lead.

Amen."

The Annual Meeting of the parish of Patrixbourne with Bridge took place on Thursday 4th April at St Peter's Church in Bridge.

Thanks were offered to all the volunteers who work so hard as members of the Parochial Church Council (PCC) throughout the year and especially to our Electoral Roll officer who had conducted a full revision of the Ecclesiastical Electoral roll of the Parish which now stands at 68 members. Others are still welcome to join the roll so please do get in touch with a Churchwarden if you would like a form. Thanks were also offered especially to our Churchwardens Evelyn Andrews, Laurence Dunderdale, Pauline Pritchard and Andrea Nicholson who have all been elected for a further year. During the year the PCC held 7 meetings at the Vicarage at which the mission, business and maintenance of the churches in the parish were discussed and actioned. Thanks to the careful management and stewardship of our resources by this team, the continuing support of the 'Friends' of both churches and the work of our treasurer Devin Brougham the parish was able to meet all its financial obligations again this year although reserves are low. CHRISTIAN AID WEEK 12 - 18 MAY 2019





Sierra Leone is the world's most dangerous place to become a mum. Every day 10 women die giving birth and many babies do not survive. Tenneh Bahwoh has a happy, bouncy baby, Ansumana, but her first pregnancy ended in tragedy. There was no health centre or trained nurse in her village. Tenneh nearly died giving birth and the village birth attendant could not cope. Her baby lived just three months.

Christian Aid partner, RADA (Rehabilitation & Development Agency) saw that mothers like Tenneh were in desperate need of healthcare. It started working locally, building a small clinic and teaching simple interventions to improve hygiene. It trained a local woman, Judith, as a midwife and it was she who delivered baby Ansumana. But conditions were still very basic – the clinic roof leaked, there were only two delivery beds and no lighting at night.

For 62 years ordinary people have been taking to the streets in the UK to raise money during Christian Aid Week. Last year 57,000 volunteers raised £8.5 million. Here in Bridge, Patrixbourne, Bekesbourne and Lower Hardres we collected nearly £3,000. All the money raised this Christian Aid Week will be used to build bigger, better health centres in Sierra Leone and other poverty-stricken communities and to train more midwives.

Please will you help – either by volunteering to collect in a road near you, or by giving generously when the familiar red envelope comes through your letter box? This is our chance to give the world's poorest mums and babies a chance of life.

willow has topped the popularity table for decades. The remaining half a million or so puppies come from a variety of sources. A relatively small number come from licensed pet shops and new licence requirements that came into effect in October will be a significant disincentive to selling puppies under a pet-vending licence. The other major source is almost certainly the internet. The anonymity of the internet allows a variety of illegal dog breeding activities, primarily puppy farming and the illegal commercial import of puppies via the Pet Travel Scheme (PETS). The trade is driven by the demand for puppies, the ease with which the point-of-sale and vendor can be obfuscated, poor detection and enforcement, and the derisory penalties following conviction. There is good evidence that organised crime is involved, because the profitability is high and the likelihood of a prison sentence is very low compared to smuggling drugs, weapons or people.

The new English Animal Activities Licence (AAL) reduces the number of litters requiring a licence from 5 or more to 3 or more litters per year, which will increase the number of licensed breeders, and any licensed breeder will have to display their licence number and will be inspected and issued with a star grading. Hopefully this will help to encourage high quality responsible breeders to produce more high welfare puppies, however puppy farmers will still be able to lie about the number of litters they are producing.

The reality is that hundreds of thousands of poorly bred, low welfare puppies are offered for sale each year. If you are thinking of getting a new puppy this Spring please think carefully about where to buy from. It is really important to be able to see the pup with its mother and siblings in the environment that it has been brought up in. At Bourne Vets we can offer you free pre-purchase advice with our qualified veterinary nurses to help you know what to look for when buying a new puppy. Please buy responsibly when looking for your new family pet so we can try and eradicate the hideous trade of puppy farms.
