Dear Friends

June has arrived and I hope by now we have begun to properly enjoy some warm weather and sunshine. I wonder if you are busy at the moment? Everyone I meet seems to be busy (myself included) and its often the first thing people say when you ask them how they are. It seems to be the thing of our current age, being busy, and it's easy to get drawn into an "I'm the busiest" battle with our friends, our colleagues, even our family members and spouses but we all know I think that being busy isn't necessarily good for us.

Resting is a commandment, "Observe the Sabbath day, to keep it holy. Work six days and do everything you need to do. But the seventh day is a Sabbath to God, your God. Don't do any work...." (Exodus 20:8 The Message) but I think we tend to see it rather as a suggestion and / or we allow the pursuit of our rest time to become part of the busy-ness - if you see what I mean? No one can work 24/7 (whether it's is paid work or voluntary!?). Perhaps today's trend of online working from home makes setting aside time to rest more difficult, yet more important than ever. For physical health and spiritual well-being, we need rest. Rest refuels and re-energizes us to work more effectively later. When we're rested physically, we deal better with stress and busy schedules. When we take time to refuel spiritually, we're better equipped to deal with challenges and trials that will always be part of our lives. And this is what God wants for each of us – fullness of life.

So before I go on to tell you all about all the wonderful things that are happening across the Benefice this month (yes I know – the irony is not lost on me!) I want to encourage you to be intentional about Sabbath and about rest – whatever it looks like for you, make time for it and treasure it.

This month in the Benefice we continue to join in with the global 'Thy Kingdom Come' prayer initiative, meeting for morning prayer at 9am in Bridge Church from 30th May until 9th June. We are holding the second of our Benefice vision mornings on Saturday 8th June where we will continue to explore together how we might simplify the administrative, legal and financial structures of our churches in order to reduce our busy-ness and increase our capacity for mission. **Messy Church** meets for the last time this academic year on **15th June** giving the whole team a bit of a Sabbath until we return in September and we look forward hugely to the **Bridge Community Fete** being organised by Bridge and Patrixbourne School PTA on **Saturday 29th June**. All our services continue as outlined in the service grid, they provide various opportunities to find rest in God and anyone is welcome to come along. Godparents Sunday at St Peters Bekesbourne, 5th May

The church was decked out with balloons and bunting and the bells rang out to celebrate Godparents Sunday. Stuart Field led the service and explained that Godparents' Sunday is a response to research undertaken on behalf of the Archbishops' Council looking at parents' real experiences and expectations around the baptism of their child. Godparents are part of family and church life for all the years ahead, a relationship that will last for a lifetime. So, setting apart a Sunday to celebrate and pray for this special relationship is a great opportunity to share with families and ask for God's blessing on godparents and godchildren everywhere. In response to this research two new hymns were commissioned which were included in the service.

Stuart's research found that Tertullian referred to infant baptism in his writings and it was assumed from these writings that infant baptism probably began around the 3rd century AD.

Megan explained to the congregation how she considered the choice of godparents in the recent baptism of her son who was the first baptism carried out by Estella our vicar, and Joy explained her recent choice of an adult baptism which was carried out at Bekesbourne and followed with her confirmation at St Peters Bridge.

The many children in church created celebratory illustrations which were displayed on Stuart's trademark washing line strung between the pulpit and the lectern. A special cake had been made to mark the celebration of Godparents and it was enjoyed by all along with coffee and teas served in the bell tower by Wendy and Dave Durrell.

There will be a rogation walk on the 26th May followed by a barbecue at The Old Palace. The next Songs of Praise at Bekesbourne will be our annual Pet Service, so bring your pet along to join in on June 2nd at 10am.
