

Trinity Sunday finishes off the season we have been in by inviting us to think about and celebrate the unique 'three-in-oneness' of our God. God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit. Since the phrase was first coined by Tertullian in the 3rd Century this core doctrine of the Christian church has been puzzled over by worshippers and theologians alike. And so I wondered as I preached on this at the weekend what makes it so incomprehensible? If I look at my own self I can clearly discern three things about me which define what or who I am - I am wife, mother and minister – and yet there is only one 'me'. The thing about my 'human trinity' is that the three things that I am have to combine together - my marriage, my motherhood and my ministry. They are woven together as the parts of who I am and the way in which I live my life and they have to do so with love and respect for one another. My wifeliness has to combine with my motherhood, my motherhood with my ministry, my ministry with my wifeliness and so on. I call this my 'human trinity' and unlike the Holy Trinity (which is unchanging) my 'human trinity' has changed as I travel through life. But perhaps you have a 'Human Trinity' of your own - three things about you that make you the person you are in the life you live at the present time. Is this a way perhaps to help us understand the 'Holy Trinity'?

We are reminded in John's Gospel that God is love and those who live in love live in God. The thing with love, is that it cannot exist in isolation, so for God to 'be' love, there needs to be interaction - an interaction which the Holy Trinity enables; the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit each love and serve the other in a bond of unity, and we are called to do so likewise. I hope by now we have reached a point where we can see that constant division and battling with one another is not a healthy way for us to live in community and that the pursuance of joined up thinking and togetherness bring better prospects for us to thrive as humans (although when you look at the way some of our politicians behave it does make one wonder!).

In our own church community we are working to bring together the organisational, administrative and financial aspects of our life together so that we can work more closely together, share our resources, ensure the future of all of our 5 churches and be a continuing prayerful presence in each of our villages – all so that we can be more effective witnesses to the love of God, expressed and enabled by the Holy Trinity here in our small part of God's world.

Bekesbourne Explorers

For the past twenty years a small group of walkers has enjoyed a monthly walk in the countryside of East Kent in and around Bridge and district. We call ourselves the Bekesbourne Explorers because that is where we are based, but actually at least half the group are residents of Bridge and others come from further afield. It is very informal. There is no charge and it is open to everyone. We are mostly now retired people - ladies and gentlemen. There are usually about fifteen of us and dogs are welcome too. Our walks are gentle - we choose wide paths to enable plenty of chatting; we avoid stiles and hills; and we stop and wait for anyone who is struggling to keep up. 

Woodpeckers Nursery

You may remember that in June's On the Nail we wrote to ask for support with our legal fees to help to secure the lease for the land that our building sits on. The lease proposed by Kent County Council will mean that whatever happens a nursery will occupy the site for at least the next decade ensuring that there will be an early years provision for the families of Bridge and the local villages until at least 2029. The lease we have been offered is a very reasonable rate and we are very keen to get the paperwork sorted as quickly as possible. However, to get this done we need to have solicitors involved which comes at a cost. We need to raise around £3500 to cover the legal costs of both sides (unfortunately standard practice in commercial conveyancing) and so to do this we have set up a crowd funder page. The crowd funder page to donate towards our fees is now live and every penny pledged will help to get the lease finalized. CHRISTIAN AID WEEK 2019



Since Christian Aid Week started 62 years ago times have changed. Where collecting house-to-house was once done by lots of charities, now Christian Aid is the only national organisation that raises money in this way. It's still worthwhile - \pounds 8.5 million was raised last year - but it's getting harder for all sorts of reasons. One is that people pay for more with cards and keep less ready cash in the house.

Christian Aid is anticipating that money raised through house-to-house collections will continue to reduce over the coming years and there will be a need to find ingenious solutions to this by exploring a variety of other fund-raising activities.

However, I'm happy to report that in Bridge, Patrixbourne, Bekesbourne and Lower Hardres we have bucked the trend this year! Our house-to-house collection actually increased, raising £2,453.29. Overall our total of £2,586.98 was a little down on last year due to a smaller total of other donations, but this is a fantastic reflection of the generosity of people in our villages in giving to those who are most in need.

A huge thank you to our loyal team of collectors, some new this year, who tramped the streets delivering and collecting envelopes, to the counters of the money and to everyone who donated. Thanks too to Bridge & Patrixbourne Primary School who for the third year running learned about Christian Aid's work and had their own collection.

With the money raised this year Christian Aid will be able to help its partner organisations in Sierra Leone to build more health centres and provide improved maternity services, so that mothers can have babies who will survive and be able to lead healthy lives. Thank you.






